Summer School Hunger Relief Program



Program Overview

The Summer School Hunger Relief Program is offered by the Fork Farms Foundation to fund the operation of school gardens in the summer months when they would normally go unused.

A pilot run of this program will take place from June to August 2023 and will enable five Green Bay-area schools and after-school programs to operate their existing indoor or outdoor garden for the duration of the summer. Grantees will be required to form a relationship with a local food pantry and donate their summer harvest.

Participants will receive a \$2,000 stipend plus growing supplies. The stipend can be used on the following:

- Compensate the teacher who is managing the farm over the summer and engaging students in the project
- Invest in additional STEM learning materials
- Transport students by bus to the partner hunger relief organization to volunteer

Our Goal

This pilot will assess the impact of engaging K-12 schools and after-school programs during the summer months to grow fresh produce and donate it to local hunger relief organizations.

Our goal for this program is that grantees and food pantries will build deeper relationships, students will grow in their understanding of farming and community service, and that participants will continue to donate a portion of their harvests during the school year.
